

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### Overview and Recommendations

#### Background

- Uncomplicated urinary tract infection (UTI) is formally defined as acute cystitis or pyelonephritis occurring in healthy premenopausal, nonpregnant women without underlying urinary tract abnormalities.
- Urinary tract infection is the most commonly occurring bacterial infection in the outpatient setting in United States.
- Common risk factors include:
  - sexual intercourse
  - spermicide use
  - new sexual partner
  - previous urinary tract infection
  - history of a UTI in a first-degree female relative
- *Escherichia coli* is the cause of the great majority of infections, followed by other enterobacteriaceae.
